

Kolping History – November 2014

During the last month, contributions (of photos, documents, etc.) and assistance came from Carl Kreimer (son of Hermann Kreimer, king in 1936), Dolly Fleischer, Otger Kappen, Ben Geers, Gert Schroeder, Gene Bertke, Jim Schnieder, Gary Gerdes, Frank Fellerhoff (son of Henry Fellerhoff, founder), Carolyn & Henry Althoff, Msgr. Anton Dechering, Maria Dechering, Mike Seibel, Alberta Seibel, Josie & Gottfried Schlembach, Mary & Gus Kramer, Margaret Borchers, Rosalie Schroeder (daughter of Ben Niemann and niece of George Niemann, president in 1926 and Joe Niemann, king in 1934), Lisa Trump (granddaughter of Ben Niemann), Ric Strecker & Rita Ann Strecker Adams (son and daughter of Dave Strecker, king in 1957), Peter Herbon, Jr., (son of Chess Club leader and soccer team member, Peter Herbon, Sr., from the 1930s), Emmi Rosen, Ben Jansen (son of Ben Jansen, Sr., founder), Celeste & Otto Hermes, and Joan & Herman Koehling. These people bring the total number of contributors to 143.

We visited 1523 Republic Street with Josie Schlembach, Werner Wilke and Gene Bertke, as well as three special guests – Gottfried Schlembach, Henry Althoff and John Tensing. These three lived in the Republic Street Kolpinghaus in the fifties upon their arrival in Cincinnati. We took some good pictures of the day, including some of the tour we took of St. Francis Seraph Church that was the site of many Kolping functions in the early years of the Society. We were joined by one of Mike's former students who is the Commander of District 5 of the Cincinnati Police Department. Can't be too safe, you know! While there, Henry Althoff took a close look at the words, "Gott segne das ehrbare Handwerk", that are carved in stone above the doorway. Unfortunately, it was determined that there is no way to remove and preserve them.

Time is Running Out

It seems like just yesterday that it was January and the search for the history of the Kolping Society began. Now, only **two months** remain for collecting pictures and other information. How about some old photos and information relating to The Bakers Ball, The Queens Ball, Polkafest, Winefest, Tuesday Workers, Schützen Club, Young Kolping, Teens Club? Does anyone have any? Ric Strecker, Joan Rehling and Kay Kempe Huss had a few Queens Ball pictures. If you were part of these groups, please look around your house for some pictures.

Has anyone ever seen a collection of Ladies Auxiliary meeting minutes? We have the minutes from the 1930s, but nothing after that.

Photos of all but one king, and most of the queens, have been found. The last one will be in our hands shortly. Photos of all the presidents have been found. The list of all known Kolping members is approaching 4,100.

We have made contact with the children of nine of the founders and the son-in-law of a tenth founder. Still to be contacted are children of one more founder - Henry Sellmeyer. The twelfth founder, Chris Huthmacher, had no children, so we don't know who to contact. Does anybody know if Chris and Dora had nieces, nephews or someone else who managed their affairs?

We had a nearly five hour session with Mary and Gus Kramer to identify faces in some of the nearly 2000 photos we have found. How's that for a welcome back to Cincinnati for Gus? Anybody else want to take a stab at this identifying faces thing? We'll keep it to far less than five hours! Of course, Emmi Rosen probably won't believe that last sentence!

There is still time for you to write your memories of being a Kolping member. The following questions might spur you on to write those memories. When did you join Kolping and why? How many generations of your family have been involved in Kolping? What are your earliest memories of Kolping? What are some of your favorite memories of Kolping? Did you belong to any sub-groups? What activities were you involved in? Any particular stories to tell regarding these activities? What offices or positions of leadership did you hold at Kolping? Which years? How has being a member changed your life or made it better? **Whether you have been a member for only a few years or more than fifty, your contributions to the Society are important and they deserve to be remembered.**

Over our nearly nineteen years as members of Kolping, we have come to know so many long time members who have given their all for the organization. We witnessed this giving for nineteen years and now can see the further contributions of these people, as we go through minutes of meetings from years before we knew them personally. We could place a long list of names in this spot, but you already know who you are, and you don't need to see your name here. The part you played in building Cincinnati Kolping needs to be recorded in the book by YOU. What you did was important and needs to be remembered! To the children and spouses of members who have passed away - We hope that you can write about your loved one's contributions to the Society, so that his/her memory can be preserved.
