Do you have one of those old photo albums with black pages and pictures held in place by photo corners? Pete Dinnesen and Mary Ann Birn Rathman have them and they are treasure troves of good pictures. Your old albums could hold some treasures too! Sitting in the homes of members and the children of former members, looking through photo albums, has become our hobby over the last nine months. It is great fun and rewarding.

Does anyone know a child or grandchild of Konrad and Mary Tholen, king and queen in 1942? Does anyone know the children or grandchildren of Joe & Johanna Niemann, king and queen in 1934? We need a contact person for these two.

We are happy to bring a large file of old photos to anyone who would like to do some identification of the faces of long ago Kolping members. If you were active at Kolping in the fifties and sixties, you can probably help out with this.

In 1960, Father David Hiller was doing the *Kolping Bulletin*. We have come across a few of the issues and wonder if any of the long time members have a bunch more of them buried in a box in a dark corner of their basement. If you know of things that have gone on at Kolping over the years that you think we may be overlooking, please bring your ideas to our attention.

We have the handwritten meeting minutes from the date of the founding of the Ladies Auxiliary on August 9, 1930. If they were typed, we could translate them ourselves. Ted Tegenkamp and Manfred Schnetzer can't do all the translating needed for the book alone! Can someone who is better able to read the handwriting help by just typing the minutes or translating them?

Now, we know this may sound like a broken record, but it is vitally important that your memories of being part of Kolping are included in this history book. Your children and grandchildren will be glad that you left a memory for them.

Kolping History (Continued)

IMPORTANT: We're still having trouble finding meeting minutes from 1948-1978. Does anybody know who the recording secretaries were during these decades? We tried to get the bound volumes of *Kolping Banners* from mid 1948 to 1978 from the Kolping Library in New York, but the president of the national organization will not allow them to be shipped to us at our cost. We think that some articles in the *Banner* during those years may be able to fill in some of the gaps created by the missing meeting minutes.

Maybe one of the other Kolping USA families also has copies of these volumes and can send them to us at our cost or at least photocopy any articles relating to Cincinnati Kolping that may be contained in these volumes.

We already have the bound volumes of *Banners* from 1928 to mid 1948 and they contain priceless memories of the early times of our Society. Kolping brothers and sisters from other U.S. families, please help if you can!

The Ladies Auxiliary Memory Bank Committee will be chaired by Gert Schroeder. Gert would like to have some who have been members of the Auxiliary longer than she has to help her record the history of the group over the last forty or more years.

Gert is following in the footsteps of Rick Hill, Ted Wilke, Joan Rehling, Harry Talkers and Mary & Gus Kramer (Sports), Mike Seibel (Brewers), Doris Wilke (4-H), Karrie Seibel and her cohorts (Young Families) in providing some historical background on the various sub groups. This list also includes Jim Slouffman (Sängerchor), Ted Tegenkamp (Father David Hiller Fund), as well as Terri Tegenkamp Beiter and Karen Schnetzer Wienkamp (Young Kolping, Teens), and Heinz Kalkhoff and Agnes Schlake (Pigeon Club). As of the date this article needed to be submitted, we were also trying to get a team together to recount the history of Young Kolping from the fifties and sixties. How about someone who would like to write something on the Schützen Club? The help of these members has been so valuable, since we have nearly no experience with most of these groups. Their efforts will make the history of the Society much more complete, and we thank them.

So far, we have scanned about 2400 photos, documents, etc. These items, when added to the nearly 2000 pages of photocopied items, create a mountain of information. We will continue collecting until the end of the year and then begin to assemble this mountain into a history. The response from 132 people has been overwhelming and more than we ever expected. The only problem resulting from this massive response is keeping the book to 750 pages. The end of the year will be upon us before we know it, so please bring those lost treasures into the light of day so they can be preserved.

If you know the children or grandchildren of members who have passed away, and you think that they may be in possession of old photos, etc. that might add to the history of the Society, please pass along our contact information or call us with contact information for these children and grandchildren. We are trying to leave no stone unturned in the search for the Society's history.
