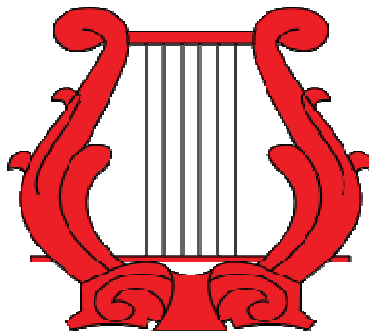

News around Kolping

It looks like winter's hold has been broken and we move onward towards spring. It seems like we have been waiting for a long time for this gradual warm-up. Winter has done a number on our facilities and the race to get things in order for the coming warm weather season has begun.

Two furnaces were replaced recently, those being, the one in the clubhouse and one in hall #2. This was contracted out because we do not have the equipment required for high work (the furnaces are mounted above the ceilings) nor do we have the qualified manpower to take on these types of repair. Thank you to Jim Schnieder for coordinating this job.

In December of last year two 20' containers were delivered to us that we need for storage. They are parked behind the garage. The spot is being prepared where they are to be placed permanently. The intent is to store stuff that only gets used once or twice year in them. Jim Stukenborg, Phil Neumann and yours truly are coordinating this project.

Many dead trees were felled over the winter in the picnic area. Most of the wood was removed as we had requested but there are number of smaller logs there that were left because some members indicated that they would be interested in them for firewood. We would like these to be removed as soon as possible because we have to get the area ready for the summer activities. So, if you need firewood come and get it before we dispose of it. Jim Schnieders is trying to find out what type of trees would make good long term replacements in the picnic area. If you are knowledgeable in this field please contact Jim. We need to plant some trees as soon as possible to replace the ones that were taken down since it will take some time for new trees to mature and provide shade.

A bunch of tree stumps need to be ground out to eliminate trip hazards in the picnic area. While we're at it, a large number of stumps along Mill Rd. also need to be removed. The picnic area needs cleaning, a good job for high school age youngsters

and boy scouts who are in need of service hours. Only skill required – be able to see and remove twigs laying on the ground.

It is our understanding that the parking lot will receive attention soon.

The carpenters are getting ready to install paneling in the foyer to the rest rooms. The paneling was delivered so the installation can begin once enough hands are available. Ferd Kappen and Manfred Ellers are covered up with requested projects and someone has to stand in line before Ferd & Manfred can get to all of them. Along with Ferd and Manfred, Gus Schroeder, resident painter, has many feet of baseboard to stain before it can be installed. The festival area received a lot of attention before winter set in will require additional attention. Right now we are all looking for the grass to pop up to solidify the area.

Much needs to be done and the number of hands to do this is unfortunately decreasing. We are calling on everyone that can to come and join us on Tuesdays. A good meal, camaraderie, the feeling of belonging and charitable involvement are the rewards. If your schedule does not permit you to join us on Tuesdays we can arrange for an evening a week when some of this work can done. Let us know your preference.

Kolping History

There was not a lot of progress on the book in the last month because of planning for the 90th Anniversary Celebration. As of April 2nd, there were 418 pages finished with about 330 to go. In spite of this slowdown, our target date for submission to the publisher remains sometime in September. Then it will be about two months until the books are available for distribution.

Book ordering will be a two-step process. If all goes as planned, you will receive pre-ordering information in the June Bulletin. The pre-ordering part of the process will enable us to know how many copies need to be printed. Once that number is known, a price per copy can be determined. No payment will be needed during this part of the process nor is anyone bound by their pre-order decision. The more copies that are ordered, the lower the price.

Then comes the second part of the process. Most people will have received their June Bulletin by June 15th. The pre-ordering period will last until July 15th. Shortly after July 15th, you will receive an order form by regular mail. It is at that time that payment will be required to be sent for the number of copies desired. The ordering period will last until September 1st. (All dates subject to change.)

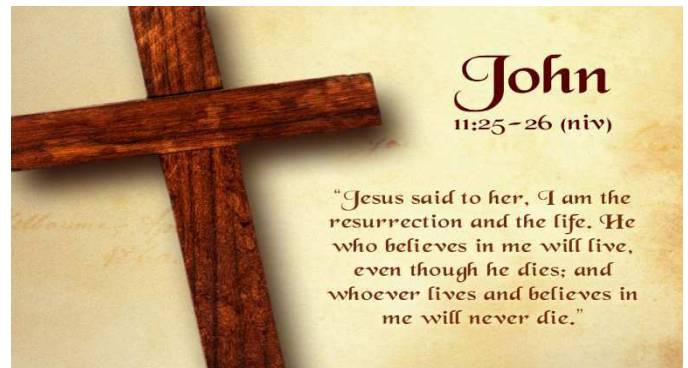
Sports Club
