#### Chairs for the taking

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Notices

As far as I can see the only thing wrong with them is their color (orange). If you need some extra utility chairs here is an opportunity to avail yourself of them. Presently they are stored in the container on the left facing them. They will be going to the dump after Schuetzenfest unless someone picks them up soon.

The work is progressing and all indications are that the parking lot will be in good shape for Schuetzenfest.

#### <u>Trees</u>

Ms. Wendi Van Buren, Regional Urban Forester from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources met in early June with Jim Schnieder and Norb Schomaker to give us her recommendations regarding our woods and the type of trees we should consider planting in the Picnic area to replace the ones that we had to remove. Her report is three pages long plus three attachments – a lot to digest. The following are recommendations that we can implement immediately without a major monetary investment.

- Honeysuckle removal to provide more light to the existing tree
- Cleanup around the outer perimeter of the picnic area
- Deep watering of the new trees between the soccer field and the festival area at least once a week
- Mulching around new trees
- Trenching around the new trees

The following requires further discussions and planning. The following types of trees can be planted in picnic area to replace the ones we had to remove: Bur Oak, Swamp White Oak, Thornless Honeylocust, and Sycamore/London Planetree.

On the perimeter of the picnic area we may want to consider planting the following trees: Tulip Tree, Blackgum, Oak or Kentucky coffee tree.

Along Mill Rd: Beech, Blackgum, Sugar Maple, Linden, and Serviceberry. The trees along Mill Rd. have been chopped up over the years by the electric company and are in need to make them astatically appealing. I don't know how many more "chopping" they can withstand before they all need to be removed. The ideal thing would be to find trees that have eye appeal and don't grow tall enough to get into the power lines.

The report and recommendations are extensive and a very good beginning to what we need to know and have to do about our natural resources that we are entrusted with. We thank Jim & Norb for their efforts in this regard.

#### <u>Help needed</u>

The Monday after Schuetzenfest we need lots of help for the cleanup. A good opportunity for students to earn credit hours since we have many jobs that they can do.

#### <u>Father's Day/</u> Anniversary Mass

## **KOLPING HISTORY BOOK ORDER FORM**

The book will be  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11", hard-bound, approximately 750 pages, with around 1300 photos and documents included throughout. There are 35 chapters on Schützenfest Kings and Queens, Father Adolph Kolping, Kolping awards, each one of the sub-groups, personal Kolping memories, the founders of the Society, the presidents, the Praesides, the 90th Anniversary Celebration, 2014-2015 activities, as well as the general chronological history of the Society and other topics. The pre-publishing cost of the book is <u>\$35.00</u>. If you live outside of Cincinnati, and will not be able to pick up the book from the Kolping Center on Mill Road, then there will be an additional charge of <u>\$9.50</u> per book for postage and shipping materials. The pick-up dates for the books will be determined later, but the time period will be between the middle to the end of November, depending on when the books are delivered. Your signature only indicated that you have read it and are aware of the responsibilities involved in representing Kolping as King.

### YOU WILL BE REPRESENTING KOLPING (first paragraph red by the shooting judge)

Gentleman, if you return to the line, you should realize that you will be committing yourself and your family to the Kolping Society for a year. When you shoot that bird down, you will join an elite group in Kolping. Being in this group requires attending events at other German clubs as our ambassador, as well as, some personal expensed for the year, over and above the amount collected from court dues. It will be an investment of time <u>and money</u>, but it will be an experience of a lifetime, so please be prepared to spend both in your year as our king"

#### DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

### YOU WILL BE REPRESENTING KOLPING AND THE KING'S FATERNITY AND YOU ARE REQUIRED TO ACT ACCORDINGLY.

- Attend the monthly Kolping general meetings
- Attend Kolping functions (Awards Banquet, Singing Concerts, Memorial and Father's day masses, fish fries, Winefest, Schlachtfest, just to name a few)
