This will bring you to the page with all the photos. Double click on one of the photos to enlarge it, and then you can just go through viewing each photo by clicking on the arrows underneath the "Slideshow" button, or you can just click on the "Slideshow" button for a full screen slideshow of all the photos. Hit the Escape key to exit the slideshow.

To download a particular photo, or all of them, to your computer, click on 'Kolping Center' in the upper left of the screen, which will then show all the photos that you can scroll through. Click on the 'Download' button in the upper right of the screen. You will then have the option of downloading the entire gallery (This takes a very long time.) or selecting photos to download. Once vou click on 'Select photos to download', you then need to click on each photo you want to download. A check mark will show in the lower left corner of each photo you select. Then click on 'Download Selected' in the upper right corner of the screen. The photos will then download to your computer.

To buy any of the photos which will be of professional quality (much better than sending to Walgreens for prints), click on the 'Buy' button in the upper right, then click on 'Select photos to buy', then click on each photo that you want to buy. Once you have clicked on all photos that you want, click on the 'Buy Selected' button in the upper right, and then you can choose prints, greeting cards, photo books, etc. The prices for different sizes are listed. From this point on, just follow the instructions to purchase the items you want. Of course, you can print your own, too.
