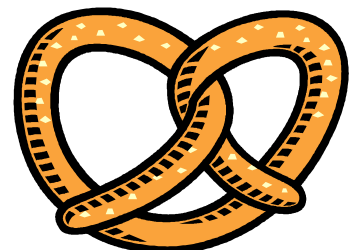

Papal visit to Philadelphia

September 25 – 28, 2015

There are only a few seats left for this trip so if you are interested please call: 724-2206 and speak to the Croswell representative instead of calling me (Doris, I will be escorting the trip) that way you will be sure to get registered quickly.

Day 1 This morning we will depart on a journey that you will likely never forget with fellow travelers anxious to see Pope Francis. We come to rest this evening near Lancaster, Pennsylvania where an included dinner will end our day. (D)

Day 2 Breakfast will begin the day before an early departure to Philadelphia. The Festival of Families Celebration will take place today and Pope Francis will participate in this international celebration of family, community and faith. We will spend the day joining in this joyful, global celebration of support and love. This Festival will broadcast a main stage program of music and will celebrate with us during this time, both to enjoy the show and to listen to six families from different continents briefly describe their joys and challenges. The Holy Father will respond with compassion and words of wisdom for all of us, speaking to those present at the event (more than a million) as well as the additional millions participating through remote viewing. In addition to the main stage, there will be a second stage and exhibits. The second, smaller stage will feature performances throughout the day by many cultural groups, educational institutional, and spiritual organizations. Performances by Andrea Bocelli, Juanes, and the Philadelphia have been confirmed. Pope Francis will speak from Independence Hall area this afternoon and from Benjamin Franklin Parkway this evening. Day 3 NOTE: Each person will receive a Croswell folding chair for the event

Breakfast starts your day before attending a local mass, then departing for Philadelphia. You may want to set your chair up on Benjamin Franklin Parkway to prepare for Pope Francis' 4:00 p.m. Mass to conclude the world meeting of Families.

Day 4 After our included breakfast we depart for our return trip home, filled with renewed understanding and appreciation for Pope Francis and his international mission of love and hope.
