A Note from Manfred Schnetzer

Some time ago, Paul Ruffing, President of the Green Township Historical Association, asked me if I could give a talk about my experience in Germany during and after World War II. After collecting old photographs and selecting captions, Nancy Pelzel helped to create an impressive Power Point presentation.

Last Tuesday, March 20, I gave my talk to about 80 mostly Seniors at the Nathanael Greene Lodge on Wesselman Road and a lot of questions followed. Before and after the meeting, Regina and I talked with John Herrmann, a 98-year-old U.S. Air Force Veteran who flew 101 combat missions in a P-38 fighter aircraft over Germany, including Stuttgart, where I lived with my parents.

If you want to read details about our experiences, you can check out our biographies from the Public Library or we can loan you a copy. The titles are: *From Friesoythe to Cincinnati* by Regina Schnetzer and *From Kempten to Cincinnati* by Manfred Schnetzer. Both books were graciously edited by Nancy and Mike Pelzel.



Our Genealogy Group continues our monthly meetings in the Clubhouse. Those attending enjoy exchanging information. All are welcome!

We will next meet on **Sunday, April 15 at 2:00 pm** for an hour. The first part of the meeting will focus on maps and using Google Earth in your genealogical research. The rest of the time is spent one-on-one working with each other on capturing our information and expanding our skill sets.

A subtopic topic on April 15 will be "Finding your Heimat" using this technology. You have to know your "home village." We will compare Google Earth to Google Maps(using the two villages of my Weber family as an example) and learn to search Germany using both apps to find your ancestors' homes. Armed with the address and village, you can "pin" these locations in *Earth* and share with others. *Maps* gives us distances to trek, bike, or drive.

You are welcome to bring your own laptop, paper maps, and research on Germany geography. This is a great opportunity for brother and sister members of Kolping to share their research, fellow Tuesday Workers to share their immigration stories, marksmen and brewers to locate those places where they or their ancestors learned their skills.

1. Back-Magnetic to fit any article of clothing, but beware, it is NOT for those with Pacemakers. \$4.75 each.




2. Back-Two Pins can be used to fit to any soft article of clothing. \$4.00 each.
