

## Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

The life, death and resurrection of Jesus is the heart of our faith. So I think it is appropriate to review the meaning of Easter in this month's *Kolping Bulletin*. Remember, Jesus was born and raised as a Jew, in the culture and faith of his own people.

The Gospel according to Mark portrays Jesus as constantly on the move, doing things that helped people. He healed the sick, he cast out demons. Mark portrays Jesus as spending most of his time welcoming all who were ill or possessed by demons. He was moved at the sight of a leper and cures him (Mk 1:41).

When Jesus healed both the soul and body of a paralyzed man (Mk 2:1-12), something deeper emerges. Those who were experts in the Law of Moses thought Jesus was blaspheming, but his response was to challenge them.

Which is easier to say: "Your sins are forgiven," or to say, "Rise, pick up your mat and walk?" Then Jesus told the man "Rise, pick up your mat, and go home." The man rose, picked up his mat at once, and went away in the sight of everyone. Jesus showed his authority over both the physical infirmity of the man and the spiritual burden of his sins. This event astounded everyone. The people said: "We have never seen anything like this."

This scenario in the Gospel of Mark shows the authority of Jesus over both the physical and the spiritual aspects of this man's life and our lives too.

When Jesus leaves Galilee for pagan territory (Mk 5:1-20), he frees a man possessed by demons. He sends them into a large herd of swine and they rush into the sea. That scares the locals and they ask Jesus to leave their district. He returns to Galilee and brings a little girl back to life (Mk 6). Then when he sees a crowd of people following him, he pities them. Then he feeds them with five loaves and two fish. Mark focuses on Jesus' actions, not his words.

These powerful signs in the Gospel of Mark really highlight the fact that Jesus is both human and divine. His struggle is against the hidden realities of demons and against the physical ailments of those who need his healing powers.

I mention these narratives because they are stressing what is involved in Jesus' mission, his life, and his resurrection. If Jesus can bring new life into the darkness of the demonic, then our faith in Jesus can also help us carry our burdens and bring health and spiritual happiness into our lives. When Jesus was crucified, that was not the end of the story. He was raised and sent us all on the mission of building God's reign in our world today. The life, death and resurrection of Jesus is the heart of our faith.

Our care for others as members of our community, our Kolping family, is proof enough that God can strengthen our faith, hope and charity. Let's take up our crosses and let God reign in our lives. Have a holy Easter and keep growing as the family of God.

## Letter from the President

Dear Kolping Family,

We have had a busy month this past month at Kolping. The Fish Fries are going strong; we had a great King's Ball Celebration with King Bob the III and Queen Mary Pat- complete with a photo booth; the soccer teams are back at it; and the Tuesday Workers are getting ready to start mowing the grass again!

Chien Vu, one of our members who has been actively giving hope to the Vietnamese people for decades, will be filling us in on how COVID has impacted the people of Vietnam and how Care2Share is stepping in to help the Vietnamese people, especially in the rural communities.

Our April topic is **Census Records**. And note the date has been changed to the second Sunday in April the 10<sup>th</sup> from the original 24<sup>th</sup>. Do plan on attending. Always check the website for updates:

**Census** seems to be the topic of discussion as the 1950 Census is being released soon. We will touch on this US Census briefly, but will be focusing more on *German Census Records*, particularly the work of Dr. Roger P. Minert, [German Census Records 1816-1916](#). He breaks down the records' accessibility by current German states to help us discover our relatives.

We genealogists usually meet on the third Sunday of each month at 2:00 pm for an hour or so in the Clubhouse. The first part of each meeting focuses on a particular genealogy theme or topic. The rest of the time is spent one-on-one working with each other, capturing our information and expanding our skill sets. Bring a notepad and your research, a laptop if you have one.




