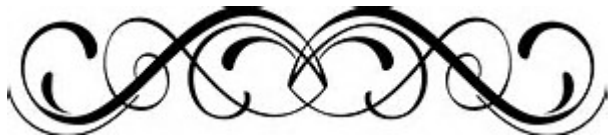
### Fat Tuesday/Fastnacht Celebration

Celebrate Fat Tuesday the German way at Hofbräuhaus Newport on Tuesday, February 21<sup>st</sup>, from 6PM until 11PM. Fat Tuesday (Fastnacht in German) is the custom of celebrating the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which begins the season of Lent, the time of fasting before Easter.

At 7:00PM there will be a children's parade with prizes and at 7:30PM, the adults' parade will take place with prizes for the four best costumes.

Fat Tuesday is sponsored by the German-American Citizens League (GACL), which was founded in 1895, and since then has served as the umbrella organization for the German societies of the region. In 2000, the League established the German Heritage Museum in West Fork Park to showcase the area's German heritage, and Fat Tuesday serves as a fundraiser for the museum. ## Kolping Genealogy

We will meet virtually once again at 2:00pm on this, our regular third Sunday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. The session will be broadcast using Zoom. Guests are welcome. You do not need to be a Kolping member, but you do need to copy the link below into your computer, tablet, or Smart phone.

**Sunday, February 19:** David Lahrman will lead us in a review of the *United States and Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) – Genealogy Division*. The USCIS Genealogy Division provides access to records submitted by immigrants who applied for citizenship. With a bit of information about your relatives, such as name and birth date, you can access documents such as a Declaration of Intention, Petition for Naturalization and Naturalization Certificate. Most of these records have been digitized by USCIS and cover a range from 1906 to 1956. There is a process and a fee to access these records, but it is well worth it. There may be several documents that contain information, not just about the person for whom you are searching, but also information about other family relatives.

## Fr. David Hiller Fund Grants

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants for children of active Kolping parents who will be attending Catholic high schools in the Tri-State area. ## Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Yikes! Feb 22 is Ash Wednesday. So today's Kolping Bulletin is a good time to write about Lent.

Most of you remember how serious the Catholic Church was about Lent, especially fasting and abstinence. No meat on days when there was a fish on the calendar. Every adult (under 59) was supposed to fast by limiting how much we ate. Of course there were exceptions and dispensations for those who were students, doing heavy labor, sick or whatever. My mother used to cook "Pope burgers" (commonly known as salmon croquettes) on days when we were supposed to abstain from meat. We were taught that the church's rules on fasting and abstinence were serious obligations under pain of mortal sin depending on the circumstances.

## Message from Fr. Dan (cont'd.)

There were discussions in religion classes about how much meat constituted a grave matter. When asked whether it was OK to eat a hotdog at the high school football game on Friday night, the young priest at our parish replied by asking, "How much meat is in a hotdog?" He explained that one hot dog could not be a serious matter because one hot dog probably had less than two ounces of meat, assuming hot dogs only had less than 50% meat. Hairsplitting legalism, I guess. I recall some in our family waiting until midnight so they could legally eat hamburgers on Friday after midnight. As children, we had to go to Sunday devotions (Way of the Cross and Benediction) or bring a note from our parents on Monday. To face the Catholic Sisters who taught us was a serious matter. Those were the days and the Catholic culture of that time.

When the rules on fasting and abstinence were relaxed by the pope, we were told that the obligation to do penance during Lent was serious, but that other things like helping the elderly or the poor might be a better form of penance. We were told to freely choose what seemed best.

Today, we realize that the Law of Christ is not legalism. Jesus denounced that in the Gospel. For example, think of how Jesus told the Pharisees that they were making all sorts of human rules while ignoring the more important matters of caring for their elderly parents, or treating the poor justly by forgiving debts rather than throwing them into jail until they paid back what they owed. He seemed particularly disturbed with those worried about appearances who neglected more important matters.

Lent remains a time for penance and returning to God in prayer, fasting and charitable works. What do you propose for your spiritual growth and drawing closer to God and neighbors? Talk about these matters in your family or with your Kolping friends.
