Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

By calendar coincidence, this year Ash Wednesday and St. Valentine's Day both fall on Wednesday, February 14th. Since the Kolping Seniors also meet on February 14th, I will bring blessed ashes from morning Mass so that the Seniors will have the chance to receive ashes and meet for that day, too. I guess Valentine's greetings are also in place.

When I was in the Philippines, the Franciscans used to joke that Ash Wednesday was the only day to receive something free from the Church, for there would be no collection at Mass. What was more striking to me was how everyone recognized the need to "repent and believe the Gospel."

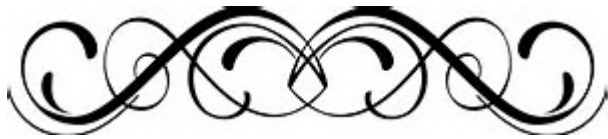
Ashes are an ancient symbol of repentance. Think of the Book of Jonah where the people of Nineveh repented at the preaching of Jonah and how their repentance received the gift of God's mercy.

As a child I was taught not to wash my face on Ash Wednesday, to remind everyone that I was a Catholic child. I am still unsure how the practice of receiving ashes squared with the Gospel words: "When you fast do not be like the Pharisees, instead wash your face so that you may not appear to others to be fasting."

Let this little reflection for Ash Wednesday be a call to live the Gospel with a healthy recognition that we are all mortals whose bodily lives will come to an end, sooner or later. "Ashes to ashes" is a great spiritual reminder of our own mortality, whether we can get to Mass or not on Ash Wednesday.

Fr. David Hiller Fund Report

Dear Kolping Members,

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants for children of active Kolping parents who will be attending Catholic high schools in the Tri-State area. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Catholic high school in the school year 2024-2025. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year, provided certain conditions are met.

In 2024, the grants will be awarded to two freshman students. Current grant recipients are also required to update their information in order to continue receiving their renewable grants. Applications and program description will be available in the Hiller Fund mail slot in the Kolping copier room. Applications should be sent directly to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation, 324 E. 4th St., Cincinnati, OH 45202, who will determine the awardees. The applications are not provided to the members of the FDHF Committee. Deadline is March 15, 2024. Kolping Genealogy

We will meet "live" at Kolping at 2:00 pm on our regular third Sunday, February 18. It will actually be a hybrid session, broadcasting using Zoom, but guests are welcome at the Klubhaus. You do not need to be a Kolping member.

Participant David Lahrman will lead us in a review of the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) – Genealogy Division. The USCIS Genealogy Division provides access to records submitted by immigrants who applied for citizenship. With a bit of information about your relatives, such as name and birth date, you can access documents such as a Declaration of Intention, Petition for Naturalization, and a Naturalization Certificate. Most of these records have been digitized by USCIS and cover a range from 1906 to 1956. There is a process and a fee to access these records, but it is well worth it. There may be several documents that contain information, not just about the person for whom you are searching, but also information about other family relatives.

This will be a leader/participant-led Zoom meeting (David Lahrman), but also we local genealogists are meeting at the Kolping Klubhaus.
