
We will cover the key recommendations and next steps to ensure transparency and enhanced financial controllership moving forward.

#### **Absentee Ballot Process**

Absentee ballots must be requested in writing. Please note in your request if you would like to receive a copy of the candidates' resumes. The absentee ballots shall be mailed to the address of the absentee voter as indicated, with an inner envelope and a pre-addressed return envelope.

The absentee voter shall complete the ballot, seal it in the inner envelope, and insert into the pre-addressed envelope, mailing directly to the Society. Make sure to have your return name and address on the outside of the pre-addressed envelope. All returned absentee ballots must be received by the Election Committee prior to the election.

### **Kolping Genealogy**

The **October 20**<sup>th</sup> session will focus on five new tools (https:/blog.myheritage.com/tag/photo-tools/) developed by the talents of those in the employ of *MyHeritage*. **Time: 2:00 P.M. in the Klubhaus**; bring a pad of paper to take notes. *Zoom-Option*:

We will logon to the Internet and view the new photo tools developed by *MyHeritage*:

- 1. Colorization
- 2. Enhancement
- 3. Dating
- 4. Organizing
- 5. Scanning

How to use:

- Scanning: Reimagine automatically detects and crops scanned photos using AI.
- Organizing: The new List View allows you to see thumbnails of your photos along with the meta-data relating to each photo, including the title, the people tagged in the photo, and the date and place where the photo was taken. Missing information can then be entered inline, easily.
- Coloring and Dating: The photo colorization technology that powers this feature was licensed by *MyHeritage* from *DeOldify*. Viewing the same images in color brings them to life like nothing else can. Colorized historical photos can spark interest in the past and help us relate more personally to events and people from times gone by.
- Photo Enhancement: The technology for enhancing photos was licensed by *MyHeritage* from the creators of the Remini mobile application. They developed machine learning technology to enhance photos by upscaling (increasing the resolution) the faces that appear in them. This produces exceptional results for historical photos, where the faces are often small and blurry, but works equally well on new color photos too.
- PhotoDater<sup>™</sup> is one-of-a-kind: *MyHeritage* is the only genealogy service that offers date estimation for historical photos.

### **Kolping Sängerchor News**






