Message from Our Praeses, Fr. Dan

Our founder, Blessed Adolph Kolping, was a great believer in the value of education and faith. However, because his family was poor, his parents could not afford higher education. So his parents apprenticed him to a master shoemaker. Adolph worked hard to advance himself. Eventually he became a journeyman. All the while he wished to become a priest.

Kolping experienced the difficulties of journeymen shoemakers while he was learning all he could to become a master cobbler. Going from town to town, the young Adolph had to find master shoemakers willing to accept him and pay him to work while he was still learning more and more about his trade. It was hard but honest work. As a journeyman, Adolph found the work difficult. Without the support of family and friends, many journeymen turned to gambling and other temptations. His faith in God helped him.

When Adolph was twenty-two, he first told his confessor that he believed he was called to the priesthood. Yes, his confessor advised him to continue his trade as a shoemaker. Nevertheless, Adolph went back to school to complete the requirements for entry into the seminary. He was in school with students several years his junior.

When he found a benefactor willing to pay for his seminary education, Adolph Kolping left shoemaking and was able to pass the requirements to become a priest in the Köln diocese. He even did advanced studies in Munich under famous professors. But his first assignment as a Catholic priest was to a poor parish where he saw the pain of poverty caused by the Industrial Revolution. Responding to the needs of the poor, Father Kolping dedicated himself to the welfare of the families whom he served.

With his experience as a journeyman shoemaker, Fr. Kolping soon learned how to start an organization which could benefit working class families. In time, that organization grew into the society which now bears his name—our Catholic Kolping Society. The organization expanded all around Europe. Eventually German immigrants brought the Kolping Society to the United States.

The Catholic Church celebrates the feast of St. Joseph every March 19. Because St. Joseph was a favorite saint of Father Kolping, it is our Cincinnati Kolping custom to celebrate our significant anniversaries as members of the Kolping Society around the time of the feast of St. Joseph as well. (See the shrine to St. Joseph outside our Kolping Center.) That is why we celebrate our annual Awards Banquet and remember our long-term Kolping members. It is by the grace of God that we have so many who continue to enjoy membership in our organization and work to spread our Kolping values today.

Please take part in our Mass and Awards Banquet on April 6. I understand that there are more than fifty members celebrating significant anniversaries this year. Praise God.

Kolping Genealogy

We will meet at 2:00 P.M. <u>live</u> at the Kolping Clubhouse on **Sunday, May 18**th. We will host two parts of this *Photo Forensics* session. The first part will feature David Lahrman, who will explain the process of evaluating those old photographs we all have of family members and beginning to identify people, dates and places by leading us through examples from his family. The process, while it can be tedious and time consuming, is well worth the time and effort. The process includes collecting as many family photographs as possible that you can find, digitizing them so that you can study them on the computer screen and reviewing them against other photos and documents that have been collected. We will talk about some of the tools to use and show you examples. This will <u>not</u> be a Zoom session, but live.

Both David and Tom will bring their matching Epson PerfectionV600 Photo Scanners and laptops to then show you how to properly scan your family photos using Epson Scan, the program that comes with these devices. Your task is to bring those treasures from your homes, either black-and-white or color. Do you have *Photoshop* or *Photoshop Elements* from Adobe? We can show you how to scan directly into these programs to enhance your family photos digitally.

This session will undoubtedly run over the usual hour reserved for our sessions, so please be prepared to stay longer. You may bring your laptop and external flash drives to copy your photos.

 - a. senior year of high school in the Fall of 2025;
 - b. an accredited college or university;
 - c. an accredited trade school
- 2. Candidates must be active Kolping members or an immediate family member of an active Kolping member.
 - a. Immediate family will be defined as spouse, child, grandchild or great-grandchild.
 - b. "Active" is defined as a member who is current with their dues for at least two years.
- 3. There is no age requirement.
- 4. College students who were awarded a scholarship in 2024 will not be eligible until 2026. High school seniors who were awarded a scholarship in 2024 can apply for the college-level scholarship.

Applications must be submitted no later than April 30th, 2025 to qualify for consideration.
