## A Letter from the President

Dear Kolping Family,

At the September 12th Special General Meeting, the vote on the proposed Bylaws did not pass. While this was not the outcome the Board and I had hoped for, I want to take a moment to thank the Board for the significant effort they put into drafting the proposal, as well as the many members who took the time to come out and vote. That being said, the important governance and operational issues within our Society remain. These challenges have not gone away and we must work together, in a spirit of collaboration and trust, to address them.

The most pressing matter before us now is leadership. For 2026, our Society must fill seven Board positions, including the offices of President and Vice President. As of this writing, no one has stepped forward to run for either the President or Vice-President roles. Yet if we are to move forward, we need leaders who are willing not only to raise questions, but also to take on the responsibility of defining effective and equitable solutions as entrusted Board members. We are always seeking leaders who will help make our Society stronger and better-what our German founders called *Besser Machen*. This is the heart of Kolping: to take what has been entrusted to us and leave it better for the next generation.

Per our current Bylaws, candidates must be nominated during the General Meeting on Friday, October 3rd in order to appear on the ballot. This deadline is essential so that absentee ballots can be prepared, distributed, and returned in time for our November 7th election. I ask each of you to prayerfully consider this opportunity. If you feel called to serve, or know someone who might, please step forward.

The Cincinnati Catholic Kolping Society has always thrived when members have chosen unity over division, service over self-interest, and active involvement in our shared mission. We owe it to one another, and to future generations, to carry our Society forward.

I believe that with open hearts, mutual respect, and faith in the vision of Blessed Adolph Kolping, we can restore harmony, support new leadership, and move forward stronger than before.

#### **Absentee Ballot Process**

Absentee ballots must be requested in writing. Please note in your request if you would like to receive a copy of the candidates' resumes. The absentee ballots shall be mailed to the address of the absentee voter as indicated, with an inner envelope and a pre-addressed return envelope.

The absentee voter shall complete the ballot, seal it in the inner envelope, and insert into the pre-addressed envelope, mailing directly to the Society. Make sure to have your return name and address on the outside of the pre-addressed envelope. All returned absentee ballots must be received by the Election Committee prior to the election.



## **Kolping Genealogy**

On Sunday, October 19 at 2:00 pm, Mr. Charles Lintz (retired NARA employee) will be talking about where the different *NARA-WWI and WWII Draft Cards* are located within NARA and how to request copies of the draft registration cards.

During World War I and World War II, men in the United States were required to register for the draft. Draft registration cards can be useful for finding out more about your ancestor. In some states, there were not yet vital records being recorded by the government, so a man's draft registration card may give information you won't find elsewhere.

There were 3 registrations for World War I and 6 registrations for World War II. The information may differ because there were several different versions and questions on the registration.

These military records help us build on our family trees by offering aids using select research tools to find more information about family members. Note that men were only registering for the draft; locating a draft card does not indicate that a man served in the military.
