

Fr. David Hiller Fund Report

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3000 grants for children of active Kolping parents who will be attending Catholic high schools in the Tri-State area. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Catholic high school in the school year 2026 - 2027. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year provided certain conditions are met.

This year, the Father David Hiller Fund invites students to apply for the scholarship by submitting a 500-word essay explaining why they wish to attend a Catholic high school. We encourage you to reflect on how a Catholic education will support your spiritual growth, academic journey and personal development. This is an opportunity to share your thoughts on how faith, community and service will shape your high school experience and prepare you for the future.

Current grant recipients are also required to update their information in order to continue receiving their renewable grants. Applications and program description will be available in the Hiller fund mail slot in the Kolping copier room or at:

Kolping Genealogy

On Sunday, January 18th at 2:00 P.M., you can learn about one of the most powerful software programs called Family Tree Maker 2024 (FTM 2024). FTM 2024 is a major new Family Tree Maker edition that takes this grand old brand to places its creators could only have dreamed of when it was first published back in 1989. It is the standard for detailed personal genealogy research (<https://www.mackiev.com/ftm>).

If you are new to family genealogy, you'll appreciate how this intuitive program lets you easily build your family tree with simple navigation, tree-building tools, and integrated web searching. If you are already an expert, you can dive into the more advanced features, options for managing data, and a wide variety of charts and reports.

MacKiev's FTM24's functions are divided into eight major "Workspaces", accessible from tabs across the top of the screen within the application: Plan, People, Places, Media, Sources, Publish, Web Search, and Connect. On Sunday, January 18th, Mr. David Lahrman and Dr. Tom Montgomery will be reviewing two of the eight menus in the new FTM 2024 software program. David will concentrate on *Sources* while Tom focuses on *Media*.

We will continue to focus on two of each of these menus every other month, having begun in November 2025 with People and Places, and in March 2026 we will review Web Search and Publishing.
