

Did you know ...

....Cincinnati's Roebling Bridge (1867) is a smaller version of the Brooklyn Bridge in New York City. Until the Brooklyn Bridge opened in 1883, it was the longest bridge in the world. It remains open to foot and car traffic. <https://roebblingbridge.org>

....There are large, riverside murals on the Kentucky floodwalls, right outside Embassy Suites. There are 18 to enjoy. <https://cincinnatiusa.com/things-to-do/attractions/riverfront-floodwall-mural-tour>

... Findlay Market (1852) in the Cincinnati's Over-the-Rhine (OTR) area is Ohio's oldest surviving municipal market house. It has open air and inside shops with a variety of meats, sweets, cheeses, breads, gifts and always something interesting. <http://www.findlaymarket.org/>

... Mother of God (*Mutter Gottes Kirche*) Catholic Church in Covington was the mother-parish to several other German parishes. ... The Cincinnati Redlegs were the first professional baseball team. As part of the 150 year anniversary celebration in 2019, Mr. Redlegs benches were erected around the area. ... The widely associated symbol of Cincinnati, the Tyler Davidson Fountain, located in Fountain Square in downtown was built at the Royal Bronze Foundry in Bavaria. It is the symbolic center of Cincinnati and is where the city gathers for fun, food and enjoyment. The square is the site of the annual Christkindmarkt. <http://www.myfountainsquare.com/>

... Cincinnati has many German bars, breweries and restaurants to enjoy. Two German areas are Over-the-Rhine (OTR) (<https://cincinnatiusa.com/article/hit-town-historic-over-rhine>) in Cincinnati and Mainstrasse Village in Covington. OTR received its name from German immigrants that referred to the Miami Canal that flowed through the area, as The Rhine. Mainstrasse Village (<http://www.mainstrasse.org/>) has a German gothic clock tower, antique and gift shops, cafes and bars.
